The Parable of the Sunflower

The sunflower (*helianthus annuus*) is a beautiful flowering plant. It provides joy to all who see it and nourishment to many. As the sunflower grows, it points heavenward. Though the sunflower may be in a field surrounded by other sunflowers, it does not compare itself to others. Instead of focusing on other flowers, it focuses on the sun. The sunflower does not turn its attention to the bugs, the slugs or the weeds. Instead of facing the pests, it faces the sun. Although it is surrounded by dirt, it does not become discouraged by the dirt. It is encouraged by the sun. When covered with manure, the sunflower does not become bitter or foul. Instead, the sunflower gathers nourishment from the dung that surrounds it. When the night comes, the sunflower does not wilt. It remains tall and patiently waits for the return of the sun.

Are We Ready for the Holy Spirit to be Poured Out?

The Spirit can never be poured out while variance and bitterness toward one another are cherished by the members of the church. Envy, jealousy, evil surmising, and evilspeaking are of Satan, and they effectually bar the way against the Holy Spirit's working. Nothing else in this world is so dear to God as His church. God does not want any one person to be conscience for another. Talk of the love and humility of Jesus, but do not encourage the brethren and sisters to engage in picking flaws in the dress or appearance of one another. Some take delight in this work; and when their minds are turned in this direction, they begin to feel that they must become church tinkers. They climb upon the judgment seat, and as soon as they see one of their brethren and sisters, they look to find something to criticize. This is one of the most effectual means of becoming narrow-minded and of dwarfing spiritual growth. God would have them step down from the judgment seat, for He has never placed them there.

Gathering or Scattering?

Ellen G. White, Christ's Object Lessons, Page 340-341

Many who profess to gather with Christ are scattering from Him. This is why the church is so weak. Many indulge freely in criticism and accusing. By giving expression to suspicion, jealousy, and discontent, they yield themselves as instruments to Satan. Before they realize what they are doing, the adversary has through them accomplished his purpose. The impression of evil has been made, the shadow has been cast, the arrows of Satan have found their mark. Distrust, unbelief, and downright infidelity have fastened upon those who otherwise might have accepted Christ. Meanwhile the workers for Satan look complacently upon those whom they have driven to skepticism, and who are now hardened against reproof and entreaty. They flatter themselves that in comparison with these souls they are virtuous and righteous. They do not realize that these sad wrecks of character are the work of their own unbridled tongues and rebellious hearts. It is through their influence that these tempted ones have fallen. →

So frivolity, selfish indulgence, and careless indifference on the part of professed Christians are turning away many souls from the path of life. Many there are who will fear to meet at the bar of God the results of their influence. It is only through the grace of God that we can make a right use of this endowment. There is nothing in us of ourselves by which we can influence others for good. If we realize our helplessness and our need of divine power, we shall not trust to ourselves. We know not what results a day, an hour, or a moment may determine, and never should we begin the day without committing our ways to our heavenly Father. His angels are appointed to watch over us, and if we put ourselves under their guardianship, then in every time of danger they will be at our right hand. When unconsciously we are in danger of exerting a wrong influence, the angels will be by our side, prompting us to a better course, choosing our words for us, and influencing our actions. Thus our influence may be a silent, unconscious, but mighty power in drawing others to Christ and the heavenly world.

- **Pray** for God to take whatever actions He sees necessary to solve the wrongs in your church.

“If you are annoyed or threatened in the streets by quarrelsome boys, do not retaliate. It is truly noble to forgive and pass over a wrong; but it is mean and cowardly to revenge an injury. Let me entreat you to be above everything like engaging in a dispute, or speaking disrespectfully or sneeringly of those who annoy you, and do not respect themselves enough to behave properly. - **Pray** for all evil speaking and judgmental attitudes to be removed from your church.

A spirit contrary to the love, humility, meekness, and gentleness of Christ denies him, whatever may be the profession. We deny Christ when we speak evil one of another. Day 7

Proverbs 20:19 (NIV)

A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid anyone who talks too much.

- **Pray** for God to make it clear to you if there are any conversations he wishes for you to avoid.
- **Pray** that your church will be a safe place that builds trust and keeps confidence.

“An earnest effort should be made in every church to put away evilspeaking and a censorious spirit as among the sins productive of the greatest evils in the church. Day 8

Hebrews 10:24-25 (NKJV)

And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

- **Pray** for God to give you sweet words that will encourage people when you attend church services.
- **Pray** that your church's worship services will be free from gossip.

“There are some who make a practice of gathering up the idle tales of gossip and bringing them before the people who have assembled to worship God. The words of some are as bitter as gall; they are ever ready to repeat and exaggerate reports that will increase bitterness and contention. If difficulties arise between church members, the parties that are involved should in all humility seek for a reconciliation, but let not the church be made a field of contention. Our gatherings to worship God are in no case to be spoiled by the discussion of gossip; for this would leave a disagreeable impression upon the minds of those present.”

1 Thessalonians 5:9-11 (NIV)

For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

- **Pray** for God to use you today to provide encouragement to someone who needs building up.
- **Pray** for God to make your church a loving community that builds up all people.

Day 10

Proverbs 27:5-6 (KJV)

Open rebuke is better than secret love. Faithful are the wounds of a friend; but the kisses of an enemy are deceitful.

- **Pray** for God to give you humility and conviction so that you will be willing to accept an honest rebuke when you are in the wrong.
- **Pray** for God to remove all flattery and deception from your church.

“Our communications to one another should never savor of flattery, or deception, but should always be in truth and righteousness. Then and then only can one fulfill the work God has given him to do.”

Day 11

James 3:3-6 (NIV)

When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell.

- **Pray** for God to guide every word you speak.
- **Pray** for your church to be steered by the Holy Spirit, not by people's slander.

“You need a fresh conversion every day. Die daily to self, keep your tongue as with a bridle, control your words, cease your murmurings and complaints, let not one word of censure escape your lips. If this requires a great effort, make it; you will be repaid in so doing.”

Day 12

Colossians 3:13 (NIV)

Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

- **Pray** for God to give you a forgiving heart instead of a critical heart.
- **Pray** for your church to deal with grievances in a Biblical way.

“How patiently should we bear with the faults and errors of our brethren, when we remember how great are our own failings in the sight of God. How can we pray to our Heavenly Father, ‘Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors,’ if we are denunciatory, resentful, exacting in our treatment of others? God would have us more kind, more loving and lovable, less critical and suspicious. O that we all might have the Spirit of Christ, and know how to deal with our brethren and neighbors!”

Be hospitable to one another without grumbling.

- **Pray** for God to give you opportunities to be hospitable to people who need encouragement.
- **Pray** for your church to be a hospitable church.

Among our own people the opportunity of showing hospitality is not regarded as it should be, as a privilege and blessing. - **Pray** for God to deliver all church members from the temptation to speak evil of others.

Romans 15:1-2 (ESV)

We who are strong have an obligation to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to build him up.

- **Pray** for God to give you patience, gentleness and forgiveness for those who are weak and have fallen.
- **Pray** for your church to build up the weak, instead of criticizing those who are struggling.

“You have no right to find fault with those who do not believe as you do. You are not to criticise the minister who is sent to you, and say he is too liberal, or he is at fault in this or that, if he is preaching the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. No matter what you may think, do not allow your tongue to utter condemnation of that which you do not understand. Do not sow the seed of unbelief and discord.”

Proverbs 18:17 (NIV)

In a lawsuit the first to speak seems right,

- **Pray** for God to show you both sides of every story and to reveal the truth from His prospective.

“Some of the students return home with murmuring and complaints, and parents and members of the church give an attentive ear to their exaggerated, one-sided statements. They would do well to consider that there are two sides to the story; but instead, they allow these garbled reports to build up a barrier between them and the college. They then begin to express fears, questionings, and suspicions in regard to the way the college is conducted. Such an influence does great harm. The words of dissatisfaction spread like a contagious disease, and the impression made upon minds is hard to efface. The story enlarges with every repetition, until it becomes of gigantic proportions, when investigation would reveal the fact that there was no fault with teachers or professors.”

Matthew 5:21-22 (NKJV)

“You have heard that it was said to those of old, ‘You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment.’ But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, ‘Raca!’ shall be in danger of the council. But whoever says, ‘You fool!’ shall be in danger of hell fire.”

- **Pray** for God to protect your emotions so that you never react rashly out of anger.
- **Pray** for your church to be an emotionally safe place.

Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarreling over disputable matters.

- **Pray** for God to guard you from entering into arguments and quarrels.
